16:15-17:30	Plenary session two and Q & A: Provide decent work to young workers, parents and caregivers The second session will focus on Principle 3 of the Children's Rights and Business Principles, which states that all businesses should provide decent work for young workers, parents and caregivers. It will explore how companies in Asia have committed to support children's rights by paying particular attention to the rights of young workers, as well as parents and caregivers.
