# FHS Girls Track Finishes at Charleston... Sets Records and Firsts!

The Fieldcrest Girls Track Team finished the season strong by sending 4 events (5 athletes) to the state meet in Charleston.

The sole relay reaching the finals was the 4 x 800 the included the team of Claire Weers, Gwen Lorh-Fandel, Tessa Holland and Erin Pongracz. They finished as the 12th best team in the state.

As an individual, Tessa Holland competed in the long jump, high jump and 400 M dash. Tessa Holland's second place in the long jump of 18 '63/4" was a new school record as well

as a personal best.

Her second place final finish in the high jump of 5'6" was her best ever placing at state.

Tessa Holland's fifth place finish of 58.58 in the 400 M is a personal best and a new school record.

As a team, the 21 points scored placed Fieldcrest 11th of the 70 scoring teams

The event was an open invitational as well as a Section FFA event. The open invitational portion of the contest included teams from Illinois, Indiana, and Iowa. The team from Fieldcrest FFA placed 8th overall. More importantly, in our Section 5 FFA event, Fieldcrest placed 1st in the team contest with Joe achieving high individual honors and Colton Pettit placing 5th in the individual portion. The Livestock and Dairy Evaluation teams competed at the State FFA Career Development Event on Friday, April 24th. Colton Pettit and Joe Gensler led our team and earned "Blue" rankings by placing in the top 33% of the 449 participants in the livestock portion of the contest.


# What's Best for Kids... William Lapp, Principal




