Ursuline Seniors Sign National Letters of Intent

Wilmington, Del. – Ursuline Seniors Adrianna Hahn and Courtney Wallace made their official collegiate athletic commitments this afternoon amongst family, friends, and members of Ursuline's Athletic Department. Hahn signed a National Letter of Intent to play Basketball at Villanova University. Wallace signed a National Letter of Intent with Loyola University to run Cross Country/Track.

Hahn will start in the fall at Villanova University as a Business major. As a five year member of the Ursuline Basketball team, Hahn has earned numerous athletic awards. She has garnered four years on the All-Catholic and All-State Teams with being named Gatorade Player of the Year and State Player of the Year for both 2013 and 2014. In 2014, Hahn joined the Ursuline's 1000 point club as a junior. She has also received accolades from the Tina Thompson Classic and Philly Classic Tournament.

"I chose to play at Villanova because of the amazing vibe you feel when you walk onto campus, but more importantly Nova is a great school academically," said Hahn '15. "I am excited to play close to home so my family, friends, and coaches can come watch me play."

Wallace will enter Loyola University this fall as a Biology major. She has earned 17 Varsity Letters during her high school career. Wallace has been named to several Athletic Teams:

- All-Catholic for Cross Country and Soccer (4 times)
- All-County for Cross Country and Track (3 times)
- All-State Cross Country (2 times)

She has also been an Ursuline Scholar-Athlete being recognized for maintaining a 3.50 or higher GPA while earning a varsity letter. Other academic accomplishments include National Advanced Placement (AP) Scholar, National Honor Society Member, and Senior Class President.

"I went to Loyola over the summer for a track and field camp and immediately fell in love with the coaching staff," said Wallace '15. "The campus is beautiful and I felt comfortable there due to the school's similarities to Ursuline's traditions. It's close to home, and I loved the overall vibe of the team and university."
