Colour Code for Cleaning Equipment

- **Red cloths, mop heads and buckets** – bathrooms, shower room, sinks, toilets and all sanitary wear, floors.
- **Blue cloths, mop heads and buckets** – Lounge, dining room, bedrooms, office, drug store and other public areas.
- **Green cloths, mop heads and buckets** - Kitchen
- **Yellow cloths, mop heads and buckets** - To be used in the event of infection/barrier nursing.
