

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oak leaves





Pattern Preparation: The oak leaf (4) and acorns were prepared with paper-backed fusible web.

Stitching: Use a fine zigzag stitch in matching colors of rayon thread around the edges. Starting at the tip of the leaf, stitch the veins and stem with satin zigzag. Gradually increase the width as you stitch to the base. As you continue stitching the stem give it a gentle curve. Widen the zigzag to about 4 at the top of the stem to simulate the place where it separates from the branch.




Pattern Preparation: The oak leaf (2) was prepared with paper-backed fusible web.

Embellishing: Using a variegated teal medley 12-weight cotton thread blanket stitch the edges of the leaf. Free-motion straight stitch the veins.




Pattern Preparation: The maple leaves (7 and 4) were prepared with paper-backed fusible web.

Stitching: Free-motion straight stitch the edges and veins of the leaves.

Embellishing: Stitch the stems with a satin zigzag starting at the base of the leaf. Widen the zigzag at the base of the stem to simulate the place where it separates from the branch.



Pattern Preparation: The maple leaf (5) was prepared with paper-backed fusible web.

Stitching: Use a programmed multi-zigzag stitch around the leaves. Free-motion straight stitch the leaf veins.
