

Blank Game Boards

Blank game boards may be used for almost any skill. You will need a die from an old game. You can use game pieces from other games, coins or stones. Use a blank piece of oak tag or the bottom of a shoebox. Have a starting point and put round stickers along in a row until your ending point. You can write some things to do on the game board.

- Go back to start
- Go ahead two spaces
- Go back one space
- You get another turn
- Sorry, you loose your turn
- Take another turn

Decorate with your child's favorite stickers.

Skills for the game board.

- Sight vocabulary
- Letters
- Colors
- Numbers
- Rhyming (Use old magazines and cut out pictures)
- Spelling
- Math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division)
- Money (change in different amounts)
- Telling time

How to play the game.

Roll the die to see who goes first. The highest number goes first. Pick up a flashcard. If the child knows the answer he/she gets to take a turn. For spelling ask your child to spell the word on a piece of paper. If you have siblings of different ages give them each a different word, if it is spelled correctly he/she gets to take a turn.

Egg Carton

Using an egg carton write the numbers from 1-12 in each hole. You can put any numbers in the hole depending on your child's age. Put two pennies in the egg carton. Shake the carton. Look at where the pennies land. Add or subtract the numbers. Another activity would be to find the higher or lower number.
