- April 97 - date **Consultant Psychiatrist/ Senior Lecturer** South London and Maudsley NHS Trust/ KGT
- I am a sector consultant responsible for 55000 population with two other consultants and a specialist registrar. I share a 23-bedded acute unit and am involved with the community team. I have 4 academic/ R&D sessions. I spend one session working in the psychosexual problems clinic for which I am the consultant in charge. I spend another working with the IM&T strategy for the trust. I have been involved in the development of a clinically orientated PAS using Lotus Notes. I have a particular responsibility for CPA. I was College tutor for 18 months and the Director of Post Graduate Medical Education for 6 months. I have been Clinical Director for Lewisham for 2 years. I chair the Lewisham Clinical Governance committee. I am scheme organiser for the GKT SHO scheme (118 SHOs).
- April 95 – Aug 97 **Head of Division, Defence Services Psychiatric Centre –** Catterick, North Yorkshire.
- I was responsible for closing the in-patient facility at the Queen Elizabeth Military Hospital Woolwich and opening a new unit in Catterick. The unit consists of 34 beds and is the UK in patient facility for the three services. There is an establishment for four consultants and eight junior psychiatrists in training. There were two other consultants in post. The unit provides a specialist assessment, treatment and referral centre for posttraumatic stress disorder and alcohol/substance abuse as

well as general psychiatry. This involved considerable management demands in motivating a work force to re-locate 250 miles and integrate two teams (Army/RAF) from different backgrounds. There was a need to develop the service and negotiate for resources. This included close working with neighbouring providers to find flexible and innovative solutions to problems. In addition to my management role I ran one of the two acute adult firms and was responsible for providing and out patient service for large parts of UK for the RAF.

**Senior Lecturer in Military Psychiatry –Royal Army Medical College
Honorary Consultant Psychiatrist – Guys Hospital**

- This appointment was divided into 6 sessions as Senior Lecturer, with 4 clinical sessions at Guy's Hospital & The Maudsley. As Senior Lecturer I was responsible for teaching aspects of Military Psychiatry to a variety of courses. These included doctors, dentists and nurses on first joining the Army. The main topics were combat stress, posttraumatic stress disorder, stress management, alcohol and drug abuse and forensic aspects of military psychiatry. In addition I gave tutorials on computing skills to doctors during their introductory course. I was involved in co-ordinating research amongst military psychiatrist and sat on the research executive committee at the Royal Army Medical College. I acted as referee to papers submitted to the Journal of the RAMC. I was responsible for researching topics and preparing replies to parliamentary questions on psychiatric matters put to the Secretary of State for Defence.
- I organised an annual Tri-Service Military Psychiatric conference which is a three day residential course involving overseas delegates from NATO countries. This required raising sponsorship from various drug companies and co-ordinating all travel and accommodation for overseas delegates.
- I was involved in advising and lecturing on psychiatric matters pertaining to redundancy. I ran computer workshops at the Royal College of Psychiatrists' Tutors conference and various Royal College meetings. I was involved in organising psychiatric support to the British contingent of UNPROFOR in the former Yugoslavia and visited Croatia/ Bosnia to debrief and provide supervision to the CPN there.
- I spent two clinical sessions of Forensic psychiatry at the Maudsley with Professor J Gunn and I had two clinical sessions at Guy's as Honorary Consultant working in the Psychosexual clinic and in research and supervisory activities.

MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE

- I have had management experience in the Army, running the psychiatric division at DKMH Catterick for two years. This involved managing a move from QEMH Woolwich and the integrating of psychiatrist from the three services. In the NHS, I have been Clinical Director for over two years, and have been involved in both operational and strategic issues. I am the clinical lead for Clinical Governance and have been involved in issues of appraisal and CPD for my consultant colleagues. I am running the Sexual and Relationship problems clinic at Guy's, which involves negotiating with the medical school as well as the Trust.

PRIVATE PRACTICE

- I have had considerable experience in private practice. I was a staff consultant at Huntcombe Manor from 1994 until 1996 when it stopped admitting adult psychiatric patients. I worked at Finsbury Circus in the City until recently seeing a variety of private patients. I continue to work at Keats House. I have a large medico-legal practice and also see members of the London Fire Service and Metropolitan Police for occupational assessments.

LECTURING AND TEACHING

- I have lectured widely on a variety of subjects (PTSD, computing, psychosexual problems) and run workshops. I have considerable media experience and have been involved in videos, TV and radio. In addition to military course I have taught on the MSc course at Guys, and the MRCPsych course at Guys and also UCH. I am an examiner for the psychosexual module of the Guys MSc.

SPECIAL INTERESTS

- I have particular experience in treating and assessing PTSD through my work in military psychiatry and have been involved in both research and the setting

up of a specialised service for PTSD. I sit on the UK PTSD Group and edit their web pages.
