

Summer School Proposal

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Three Week Summer School Program

July 5 – July 21, 2011

Monday through Thursday 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM

Classes are two hours in length

Following are the descriptions of the courses we are offering this summer:

ART- UPCYCLING (Grades 4 – 8)

A new twist on recycling! Upcycling in art involves reusing materials in an exciting or unusual way. Students will create junk sculptures and repurpose everyday items to create unique and usable artwork!

ART- JEWELRY I (2-4) / ART- JEWELRY II (5-8)

Students will create fun and funky jewelry using beads, fibers, and other unusual materials and found objects. Other techniques include: weaving and loom building, clay bead making, and more.

ART- CREATIVE PAINTING (4-6)

Students will create works of art using paint as a medium.

ART- CALLIGRAPHY & SUMI BRUSH PAINTING (4 – 8)

Calligraphy is the art of beautiful painting. The students will be introduced to stylized writing and Japanese Sumi Brush painting techniques and a tie dye project.

FILMAKING “101” (5-8)

This year we will offer two sessions of this course. Students will explore the basics of filming digital videos, movie production and editing using iMovie and digital video.

BRAIN GAMES (1-3)

Brain games is offered to students entering grades 1 – 3. Teachers recommend students for the program. There are four different strands which include:

- *Mystery (Students entering grade 3)*
- *Logic (Students entering grade 1)*
- *Strategy (Students entering grade 2)*
- *World Games (Students entering grade 3)*

JUST READ! (2-5)

Selected Children's literature will be read and students will complete creative reading response activities and projects related to the story's plot, setting, and characters. Special performances and coverage on reader's theatre and poetry will assist students in developing read aloud skills and building fluency. Lots of reading practice and exposure to a variety of print will help maintain or improve the child's current reading level over the summer.

MATH REVIEW PROGRAM (2-8)

Instruction for students needing to review math skills. These classes are designed to be engaging for students. Students will experience success with math so they are motivated and ready to go at the beginning of the new school year. *Teachers will make recommendations for enrollment for these three classes.*

Offered at three levels:

1-2 Math is SUM fun

3-5 Math Review

MATH ENRICHMENT PROGRAM (1-6)

Designed for students who enjoy math or for those who do well in math but would like to extend their skills. Instruction is offered at 2 levels:

1-3 Edible Math

4-6 Math Enrichment

SPANISH CLASSES (1-4)

These Spanish classes are designed to introduce students to the Spanish language and to the Spanish Culture.

Offered at two levels:

Grades 1-2

Grades 3-4

READING REVIEW PROGRAM (4-8)

These classes are designed to be engaging for students. Students will experience success with reading so they are motivated and ready to go at the beginning of the new school year.

COOKING FOR YOURSELF (5-8)

The class provides an opportunity for upper elementary and middle school students to gain and refine cooking skills with a variety of foods.

KINDERGARTEN INTRODUCTION (PK)

This is a program to help students who will be entering kindergarten in the fall get a head start.

Students must be recommended for inclusion in this class

PHYSICAL CONDITIONING HS / PHYSICAL CONDITIONING MS

Students learn about appropriate exercise to get in shape and stay in shape.

SUMMER THEATRE (5-8)

Students in grades 5 – 8 develop theatre performance and production skills culminating in a production presented to an audience.

HANDS ON SCIENCE (1-7)

Students do a variety of science activities both in a lab setting and outdoors.

Hands on Science is available at two levels:

Grades 1-3

Grades 4-7 (potentially two sections)

Individual Reading Program

These sessions take place at the Poynette Public Library. Teachers work with students on such things as word attack skills, comprehension strategies, increasing fluency, and fostering a love of reading. Individual Reading Runs for a total of six weeks. It begins at the same time as summer school and goes three weeks into August. *Classroom teachers recommend students for the program.*

One Week Programs offered through Summer School

BASKETBALL SKILLS (2-8)

This is a one week course that will give students at chance to learn new basketball skills and refine their skills on the court. This course will not run at the same time as the regular summer school.

VOLLEYBALL SKILLS (3-8)

This is a one week course that will give students a chance to learn new skills and refine their skills in the sport of volleyball. The course will not run at the same time as the regular summer school.

Special Education Summer School

This program builds lifelong learning skills for students in our special education classes. Students do a variety of outdoor and indoor activities as well as go on several field trips. The class runs for 4.5 hours per day, three days per week. The program runs directly after our regular summer school program and goes for three weeks.

Instructional Swimming

Instruction offered to students four times a week for three weeks. Three sessions run throughout the summer beginning the week after school is out. We have a licensed teacher who over sees the program and licensed instructors and life guards who do the instruction for the classes.

Students Review material learned in their previous studies. They also work on marching band techniques in preparation for a variety of performances throughout the summer (concerts in the park, Dane County Fair, 6 Flags, etc.)

Student who will be entering 6th grade band in the fall get a chance to take lessons for the summer. Lessons are also continued for 7th and 8th graders to help them retain knowledge and develop more advanced skills appropriate to their new grade level.
