A couple celebrated their silver wedding anniversary. After the ceremony, the man was seen crying. The priest approached him and said "You should not be crying. You should be happy because you have reached twenty-five years of marriage." "That is really what I'm crying about" the man explained. "You see, the lawyer-father of my wife threatened me that he would lock me up in jail for twenty-five years if I would not marry his daughter."

"Why are you crying? Put it behind. Forget the past face tomorrow," advised the priest. But the man responded, "That is the reason why I'm sad. If I had decided to be behind bars, for twenty-five years, I would have been free tomorrow."

There is another story of a couple who had been married for ten years. The wife suffered a lot from her cruel husband. The husband was ashamed of his wife because she has no college education while he was an outstanding professional.

The husband one day had an accident and became blind. He advertised for an eye donor. Weeks passed, even months, until finally an anonymous eye donor came. By God's providence, the operation was a success.

But the husband was so angry with his wife because she did not visit him in the hospital, much less be present during the critical operation. He was planning to beat her and abandon her.

When he came home, he saw his wife, her back toward the door. Immediately he grabbed her hair and violently smashed her on the floor. Just as he was about to slap her, he noticed that his wife had no more eyes. It turned out that she was the donor.

Full of guilt, he said, "You were the donor! You gave your eyes to me. Why did you do it for me?" the wife softly replied, "I will always love you."

The first story reflects the husband burdened by a responsibility he did not want. One cannot expect a person to truly love when he is filled with regrets and ill feelings. The man saw his marriage as a punishment.

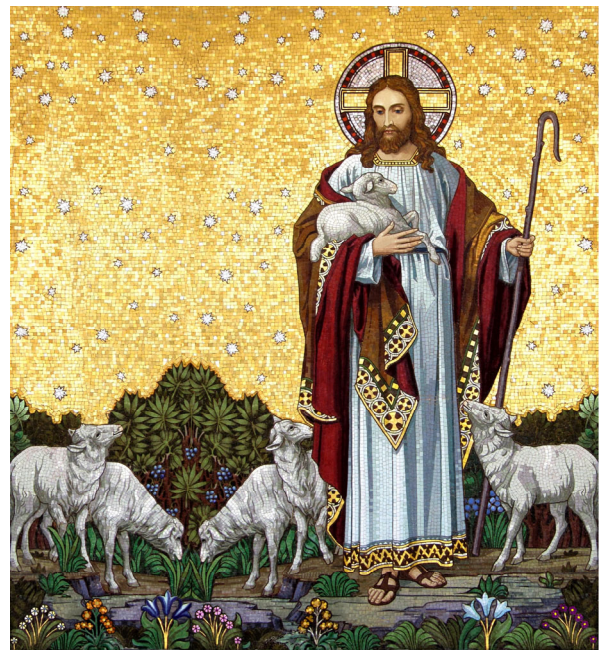
The second story reflects the heroic love of a wife. Despite everything, the wife loved her husband and sacrificed herself by offering her eyes to him. The wife considered her marriage as a commitment to love.

By declaring himself as the Good Shepherd, and us his sheep, Jesus enunciated his love for us. To proclaim one's love is a difficult thing. We know that lovers have to suffer in loving. This is the reason why in the church, when couples are getting married, they don't face each other, but they stand side by side, as they look upon the image of the crucified Christ at the center of the altar. Christ crucified is always the model of love. He is the person who loved us and has given his life to prove that love.

I am the Good Shepherd. I am willing to lay down my life for you, he declared to us. And He tells us also: "Love one another as I have loved you...As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you."

Christ invites us this Sunday to be loving shepherds to one another, willing to pay the price of love. Husbands and wives, parents and children, all of us in our community: we are called upon to imitate the love of God, the courage to stand up for that love, the willingness to serve, and to work for unity. We must not act as wolves that snatch and scatter the sheep entrusted to us. We are challenged to be shepherds by leading one another to the fold Christ Good Shepherd.

May we be one family who hear and follow Christ. May we understand and love him more so that we may carry on his love, the selflessness of his love, to be truly good shepherds like him.

Happy Mother's Day to All Our Mothers
Today on Mothers Day we recall one of the people who gave us life.

What is a mother? The latest Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty described her as "the most important person on earth. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral – a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body.

St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Galatians: "When the fullness of time came, God sent his Son. He came born of a woman... in order to redeem... make us adopted sons and daughters of God. And because you are sons, God has sent into your hearts the spirit of his son which cries out; Abba! That is: Father!" (Gal. 4: 4-6).

This is the reason why mothers have a very glorious dignity because Jesus, the redeemer, had deemed it worthy to be born, formed and loved by a mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. All mothers are special before God.

The Holy Father, enunciating the special role women in the Church declared: "Woman shares in the common priesthood of the faithful (cf. Lumen gentium, no. 10) in many ways, but especially through motherhood: not only to spiritually motherhood, but also what many women

choose as their own natural role with regard to conceiving, giving birth to and raising children: 'a child is born into the world!' [General audience, July 27, 1994]
