# **Obituary Definition and Meaning**

An obituary is a formal announcement that informs the public of a person's recent death or expiration.

An obituary is traditionally a printed notice of death; but nowadays, it can be disseminated digitally as well.

# What Is an Obituary?


An obituary is a short notice that contains essential details such as the deceased's name, date of birth, date of death, and information about the memorial service and funeral. It can

contain the photo of the deceased person as well. Traditionally, obituaries are printed or published in newspapers.

# 10 Types of Obituary


#### **Obituary Program**

You can't go wrong with a white background for your obituary program. Keep it simple and solemn with a heartfelt quote, as seen in the example below.



# **Obituary Card**

An obituary card does not need to contain a lengthy explanation. A short line or two that encapsulates the deceased individual's life or character is perfectly acceptable.




# **Obituary Brochure**


# **Funeral Program**

Aside from the name, birthdate, and date of death, you can include a short biography and an acknowledgment section in your funeral program. Keep it classic and elegant with subdued tones, as seen in the template below.




#### **Memorial**

A memorial invitation or notice should always contain the date, time, and location of the service. As for the design, you can add a cross or any significant symbol that's applicable to your faith, religion, or belief.




#### **Funeral Announcement**

You don't have to stick to white or light colors all the time. Darker and more subdued shades can also work, as seen in this funeral announcement template below. However, to be considerate and sensitive, it's best to steer clear of bright and loud colors.



#### **Funeral Memorial**

A funeral memorial invitation or announcement should be a fitting tribute to the deceased. If the person had a favorite color or photo of themselves, you can honor their memory by incorporating that into the design.



#### **Funeral Service**

A funeral service is never easy to plan, especially for the bereaved family. Make the service more personal and heartfelt by sharing a brief biography of the deceased. Of course, a few words cannot totally capture the life of an individual. But offering a small glimpse of their life and legacy might be helpful to those who may not have known the deceased well.



# **Funeral Ceremony Invitation**

Like any event invitation, a funeral ceremony can include an RSVP at the bottom of the invite. This can be particularly helpful if the bereaved family is expecting a lot of guests to attend the funeral. Include the name of the point person and their contact number or email address.








# **Funeral Flyer**

# **Obituary Uses, Purpose, and Importance**

Obituaries have a straightforward and practical use. They can be designed purely from a functional perspective but they can also have a creative element added to it. The following describe some of the main uses and importance of an obituary.

#### Remembrance

The most important purpose of publishing an obituary is to honor the memory of the deceased individual. It is usually the immediate family's responsibility to initiate this formal gesture of remembrance.

#### Information

An obituary allows other family members, friends, and the general public to know about the death. By publishing the information or sending it out virtually, an obituary is basically a formal announcement to the community.

# Clarity

It's important to indicate accurate information on the obituary. It's helpful to those interested to pay their last respects or attend the funeral if the details are stated clearly (i.e., when and where the service will be).

#### **Documentation**

Although it's not always the case, an obituary can be used for record-keeping purposes. Particularly for newspaper or printed obituaries, these may be kept on file for public record; thus, making it accessible to anyone in the community.

# What's In an Obituary? Parts?

#### Announcement


The most important section of an obituary is the formal announcement about the death. It includes the recently departed's complete name, date of birth, and date of death. It's also optional to include a brief line or two about the individual's character or life's work.

# **List of Surviving Family Members**

Normally, the immediate family members are arranged in order on the obituary. This includes the spouse, children, in-laws, grandchildren, or even great-grandchildren. The parents and siblings' names may also be indicated, if applicable.

# **Photograph**

Although it's not required, many people opt to include a picture of the recently deceased on the obituary. The size of the image would depend on the family members' decision.




#### **Details of Memorial Service**

For the public's information, you can include specific details about the viewing, memorial service, and funeral. Make sure to indicate the time, date, and location of these events.

# What's the difference between an Obituary, Tribute, and Funeral Notice?


An obituary is a formal announcement informing the public about the recent death of an individual.

The two are different. A eulogy is more of a personal tribute or heartfelt speech remembering a dead person's legacy and life.

# Who usually reads the obituary at a funeral?

An obituary is usually information that is available for the public to read. A eulogy, on the other hand, is normally read or delivered at a funeral by a family member or a close friend of the deceased.
