

# **Table of Content Uses, Purpose, Importance**

## **To Give An Overview**

Readers will be able to know what's in store for them as they read through the table of contents.

## **To Provide Navigation**

A table of contents helps readers to navigate their reading. If they wish to go to a specific section for a certain type of information, they can look to the table of contents to guide them to the right page or part.

## **To Organize**

A table of contents gives a sense of a sequence for readers as they go through a book or research journal. This can give them a sense of order and progress as they go through each chapter or section.

## **What's In A Table of Content? Parts?**

### **Headings**

The headings are the titles of chapters/sections of writing. The titles should be straightforward about the content they contain.

### **Subheadings**

Subheadings are often the titles of the chapter/section which are also divided into small specific parts. They are helpful in letting readers be able to navigate and know exactly what information or content they are going to see.


### **Title Numbers**

Numbers are placed on the right side of the titles. They are often included to give a numeric sequence for the title of the chapters/sections so that it'll be easier for the reader to remember.

## **Page numbers**

Page numbers allow people to figure out the length of the content. Readers can also navigate to whatever page they want to see.

## How To Design A Table of Content?

1. Choose a [Table of Content Size](#).
2. Decide the purpose of the table of content.

3. Select the [Table of Content Template](#).
4. Note the major sections of your writing.
5. List them down.
6. Finalize the content and download it.

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## Table of Content Vs. Outline

A table of content is a list of sections that lets a reader navigate through any writing.

An outline is a list of short sentences which describe a chapter's content.

# What's the Difference Between a Table of Content, Index & Agenda


A table of content is a list of chapters or sections that lets readers navigate through a type of writing.

An index is a list of keywords found throughout the writing which are arranged alphabetically.

An agenda is a list of topics that are to be discussed in a meeting or presentation.

## Table of Content Sizes

The table of content can take on any size depending on the chosen text size of the writing. While you are free to use any size, here is the standard [table of content sizes](#) as listed below.
