

How to Get Microsoft Excel for Free


One of the most widely used spreadsheet programs on the market is Microsoft Excel. It is frequently used for data entry, financial management, keeping track of records, and even budgeting.

Step 2: Sign In With Your Microsoft Account




After navigating to Office.com, just click on Sign In. Enter the information and password for your Microsoft account. If you don't have one, you can easily create one for free. Simply select "Create One".
