
How to Add Fonts to Adobe InDesign

How to Add Fonts to Adobe InDesign



Step 1: Install Fonts

Adobe InDesign is equipped with various fonts that work well with certain design niches, however, other designs need a specific kind and style of font that might not be in the built-in fonts. Instead, look for your preferred fonts online, and install and download them to get started.

Step 2: Unzip the File

Usually, the installed font comes in a zip file, make sure to locate the file, unzip and access the individual files accordingly.




Step 3: Save the Font File

Save the font file/s to your computer, then go to Control Panel then proceed to Appearance and Personalization, then Fonts, and select Filet then Install New Font to open the Add Fonts window.


Step 4: Locate Font to Install

Locate the font you wish to install and then click Install.



Step 5: Open Adobe InDesign

After steps 1 to 4, open Adobe InDesign to confirm that the installed font is available in your fonts options. If not, restart your computer and repeat the abovementioned steps.
