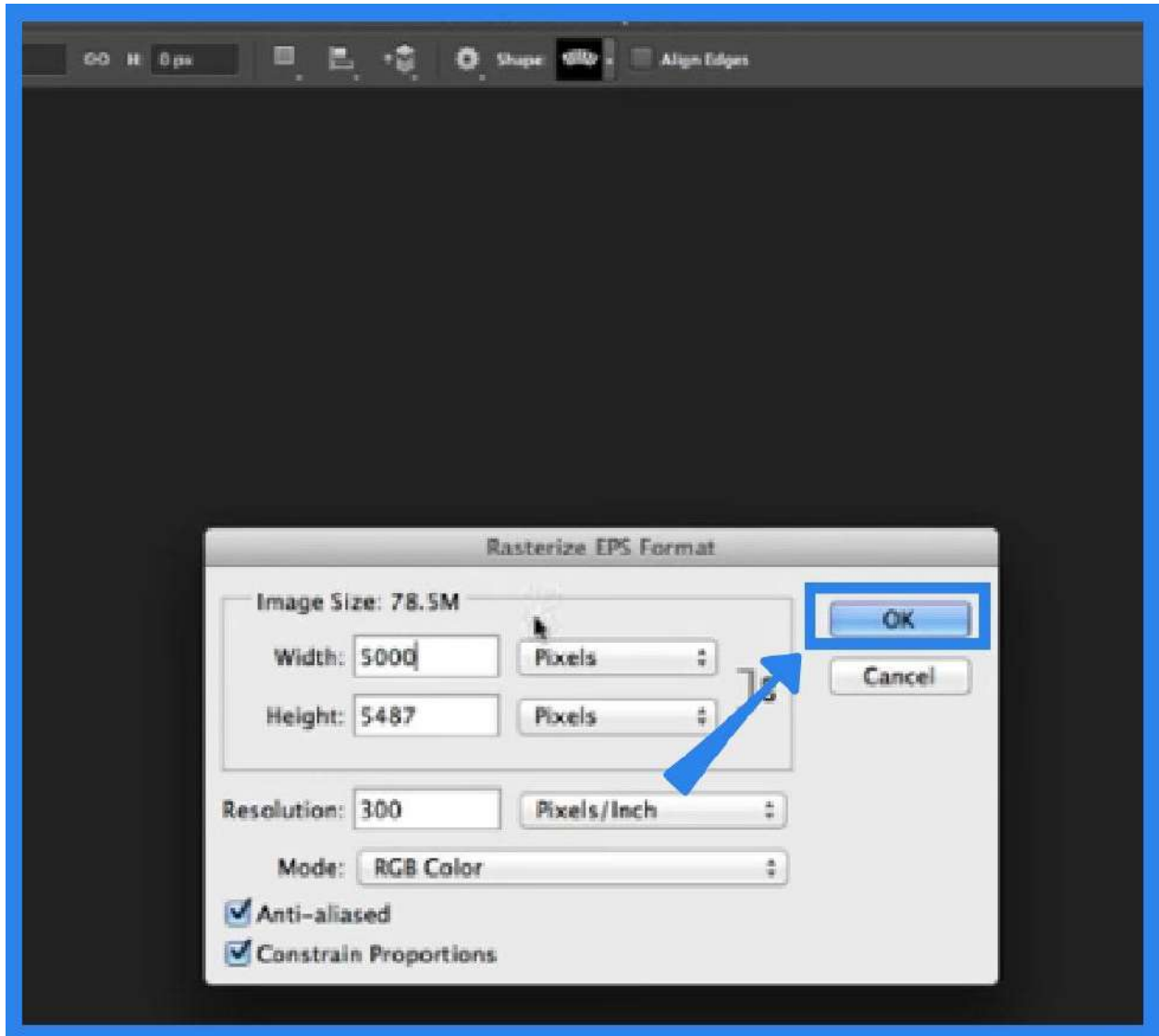
Discover how to use EPS files in photoshop. That way, you can do it easily when you need to.



How to Use EPS Files in Photoshop

Using EPS files is pretty simple to do in Photoshop. Follow these three easy-to-follow steps.

- **Step 1: Launch Adobe Photoshop**
To get started launch Adobe Photoshop and ready the EPs file you wish to use.
- **Step 2: Click 'File' and 'Open'**
Move your cursor to the menu and click 'File'. A dropdown will appear where you can click on 'Open'. This will result in a dialog box where you can find the EPS file you wish to use. Select the file and click the Open Button.
- **Step 3: Rasterize EPS Format**
Another dialog box will open called the 'Rasterize EPS Format'. Adjust the resolution, the color, and the pixels any way you prefer. Then click the OK button. This will load up the image, which should take a few seconds.



You can choose 300 for the resolution, RGB for the color, and 4000 pixels if you don't know where to begin
