La Tomatina may be a mere gimmick festival with no compelling historical significance and its origin is not as in-depth as religious holidays. However, La Tomatina has its purpose and is an important celebration. Let's discover why La Tomatina is a significant annual event.

For Entertainment

La Tomatina is for entertainment and that alone is a good enough reason to celebrate it. It's a fun activity where you hurl tomatoes at random people with all smiles and laughs. If you merely spectate the event, you can still have fun watching or taking pictures of the participants having tomatoes splash at their faces and their clothes soaked in red.

In 2002, it was declared by the Secretary of the Department of Tourism as a Festivity of International Tourist Interest. Establishments in Buñol and nearby are packed with tourists during La Tomatina, which includes restaurants, hotels, motels, and other accommodations.

Experience Traditional Spanish Cuisine

Various Spanish cuisine restaurants offer traditional dishes in celebration of La Tomatina. These dishes are delicious and unique and their primary ingredient is mostly tomatoes. So if plan to explore Spanish cuisine, the best time to do so is on the last Wednesday of August during the La Tomatina festivities.


Facebook

1. Select a La Tomatina Event Facebook Post Template.





2. Type in your La Tomatina slogan.





3. Include La Tomatina photos.






5. Save your La Tomatina Facebook post draft.



1. Choose a La Tomatina Festival Instagram Post Template.





2. Edit the text of the La Tomatina template.





3. Add a La Tomatina background photo.









2. Customize the default text in the Fill Text boxes.





3. Insert your unique logo.






