### What's In Mid-Autumn Festival?




5. Download the edited Facebook template.


### Instagram

1. Select a Mid-Autumn Festival template for Instagram.





3. Pick a solid background color for backdrops.






### 5. Download the edited Instagram post.



After editing, download the edited Instagram post template. Save the post by clicking the ellipsis button on the top right portion of the editor window. Click the Save button from the dropdown to download the template.


### **WhatsApp**

- The Mid-Autumn festival goes for three days, and trip and travel tickets are easily sold-out during the festival time for many locals and tourists.
- The Mid-Autumn Festival was once the second Valentine's Day in China, with people praying to find true love with marriage in mind.
- Other Asian countries also celebrate the Mid-Autumn Festival using different names, including Chuseok in Korea, Tsukimi in Japan, and Tét Trung Thu in Vietnam.
- The younger generation delivers lucky money through the WeChat app, which allows them to send digital red envelopes to family and friends.

## Mid-Autumn Festival vs. Thanksgiving

The Mid-Autumn Festival or Moon Festival is a harvest festival in China that happens every 15th of the 8th month of the lunar calendar when the moon is at its brightest and fullest.






