Veterans Day Definition & Meaning

Veterans Day is a United States federal holiday celebrated in honor of all the brave men and women who served in the US Army, Navy, and Air Force.

Veterans Day, previously called Armistice Day, is an American national holiday observed every year to celebrate all US military veterans, both those who died in service and those still alive.

When Is Veterans Day?

Veterans Day is celebrated every year on the same date which is November 11. It was on June 1, 1954, that the 34th President of the United States Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the legislation proclaiming November 11 as a day to honor all American military veterans.

Veterans Day History

The first observation of Veterans Day was in 1919. Back then it was known as Armistice Day as proclaimed by President Woodrow Wilson. During this time, Armistice Day was celebrated to honor the memory of those who died in the Great War (World War I) and contributed to the victory. Fast forward to 1954, former US President Eisenhower approved the legislation aiming to change Armistice Day to Veterans Day. He stated that Veterans Day is a day to honor all the veterans who served in World War I, World War II, Korean War, and other international conflicts. In 1971, Veterans Day's date of observance was changed to the fourth Monday of October which veteran groups and the general public protested. So in 1975, former President Ford approved the legislation to revert the holiday's date of observance to November 11.

Veterans Day Purpose, Importance

Veterans Day is one of the biggest celebrations in the United States. That said, you might be wondering what makes it such a big deal. So let's discuss the purpose and importance of Veterans Day.

Honor All Military Veterans

The very center of Veterans Day is to honor all the military veterans who served in the US Marines, Navy, and Air Force. All their services contributed to the peace and order that US citizens are privileged to have. They deserve recognition for their acts of bravery, for raising the American flag, and for fighting for their country's freedom.

Commemorate the End of the Great War

The Great War, which we know today as World War I, ended on November 11, 1918. That day was dubbed "the end of the war to end all wars." World War I is among the most destructive wars in history. So its end is worth commemorating and those who died in battle deserve military honors.

Visit Veterans

Some people who have family members or relatives who are military veterans will visit them on Veterans Day. They'll spend quality time with them and make them feel at home, most especially elderly veterans who served in World War II and the Vietnam War.

What's on Veterans Day?

On Veterans Day, some towns will hold a ceremony to honor all former US soldiers who served in previous wars and battles. People will also be visiting their locality's cemetery where deceased veterans are buried. There'll be parades participated by currently-serving military personnel and retired veterans wearing their military uniforms.


Facebook

2. Customize the template's default text.





3. Insert more graphics depicting the American flag.






Instagram



2. Use a Veterans Day-relevant photo as background.





3. Write your Veterans Day message.






5. Save your Veterans Day Instagram post draft.



1. Choose a Veterans Day LinkedIn Post Template.





2. Input your Veterans Day greeting or message.




In this step, head to the Fill panel and write your Veterans Day message or greeting in the Fill Text boxes. Make it short but also meaningful.


These are some of the activities you can do on Veterans Day:

- Read books about World I, World War II, Vietnam War, Korean War, and other wars involving the US Armed Forces.




