National Hispanic Heritage Month is a month-long celebration that focuses on Latin Americans, particularly their culture and contribution to American society.

National Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates the achievements of the Latino community and recognizes the impact they have on the broader American culture.

When Is National Hispanic Heritage Month?

National Hispanic Heritage Month is observed annually starting on September 15 and officially ends on October 15. September 15 is significant because it commemorates the anniversary of the Cry of Dolores-the event that marked the beginning of the Mexican War of Independence.

National Hispanic Heritage Month History

National Hispanic Heritage Month began as Hispanic Week in 1968. Hispanic Week was established by President Lyndon Johnson and was eventually expanded to 31 days by President Ronald Reagan after legislation was pushed by Rep. Esteban Edward Torres. On August 17, 1988, the observance was enacted into law with the approval of Public Law 100-402. And since 1989, National Hispanic Heritage Month has been proclaimed by every United States president beginning with George H.W. Bush.

3. Add Images and Graphics



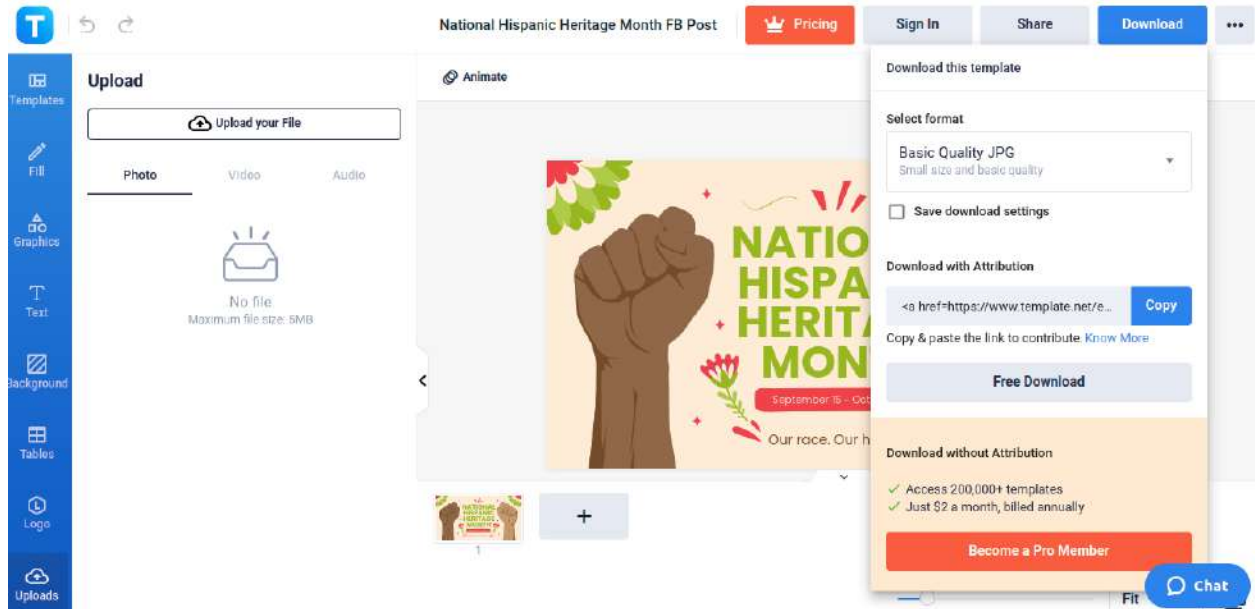

3. Provide Additional Graphics



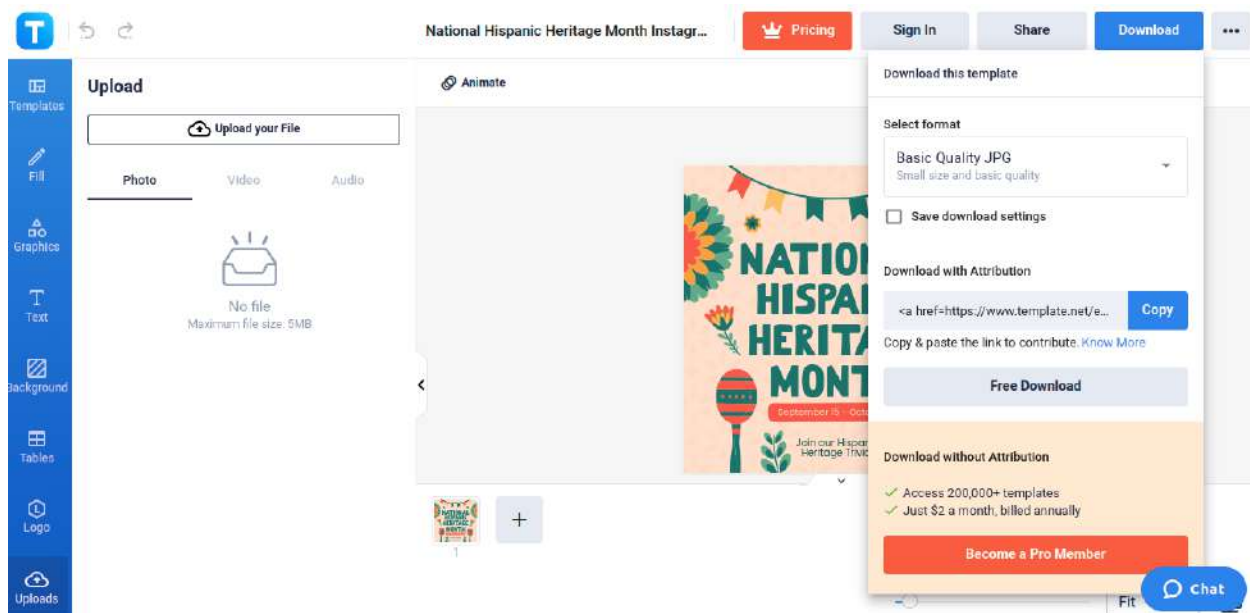

The law that expanded National Hispanic Heritage Month into a month (from what was initially just a week) was sponsored by Rep. Esteban Edward Torres and was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan.

What is the National Hispanic Heritage Month theme?

The theme for National Hispanic Heritage Month for 2022 is “Unidos: Inclusivity for a Stronger Nation”.

What does National Hispanic Heritage Month stand for?

National Hispanic Heritage Month stands for the history and culture of Hispanic and Latin Americans in the United States.

How do people celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month?

National Hispanic Heritage Month is marked by various types of events including honoring the achievements of Hispanic Americans and celebrating Latin American dishes, music, dance, and religious traditions.

To appreciate and celebrate the contributions of Latin American history and culture to the United States.

What do they wear on National Hispanic Heritage Month?

Women wear embroidered Mexican dresses with ruffled skirts and blouses while men are encouraged to wear guayaberas and other traditional Hispanic costumes.

How do you honor National Hispanic Heritage Month?

By recognizing and acknowledging the achievements of Latin Americans and celebrating the Hispanic communities in your area.

What is important about Hispanic Heritage Month?

National Hispanic Heritage Month honors the important contribution and influence that Hispanics have had on American culture.
