Czech Founding Day Definition & Meaning

Czech Founding Day, also called Independent Czechoslovak State Day, is a Czech public holiday that commemorates the establishment of the first Czechoslovak state that was free from the Austro-Hungarian Empire.

Czech Founding Day is a national holiday in the Czech Republic that celebrates the freedom attained by the first Czechoslovak state in 1918 and spearheaded the territory's complete independence.

When Is Czech Founding Day?

Since it became an official public holiday in the Czech Republic, Czech Founding Day has always been celebrated on October 28 every year. In 2022, Czech Founding Day falls on the last Friday of October.

Czech Founding Day History

The first Czechoslovak state that was independent of Austro-Hungarian rule was established on October 28, 1918. It was among the first excellent parliamentary democracies in Europe and was able to survive the global depressions of the 1930s. However, Czechoslovakia was ruled by Nazi Germany a few decades later and was under the Soviets in the latter half of the 1900s. Fast forward to January 1, 1993, Czechoslovakia peacefully disbanded into two countries, Slovakia and the Czech Republic. Though Czechoslovakia is no longer on the map, the people of the Czech Republic celebrate its founding day every October 28 like how the Americans celebrate the [4th of July](#).

Czech Founding Day Purpose, Importance

Czech Founding Day is a celebration ingrained in the culture and customs of the Czech Republic, and the Czechs have very good reasons to be joyous on that day and raise their flag proudly.

Commemorate the Creation of Czechoslovakia

The creation of Czechoslovakia in Wenceslas Square on October 28, 1918, and the foundation of its politics and departments is an incredible story in Czech history. The establishment of Czechoslovakia is considered the birth of their country and proof that their nation can stand independently. Czechoslovakia may no longer exist today but it'll always have a place in the heart of the Czechs. They're thankful for that state as it helped to shape the Czech Republic into what it is today.

What's on Czech Founding Day?

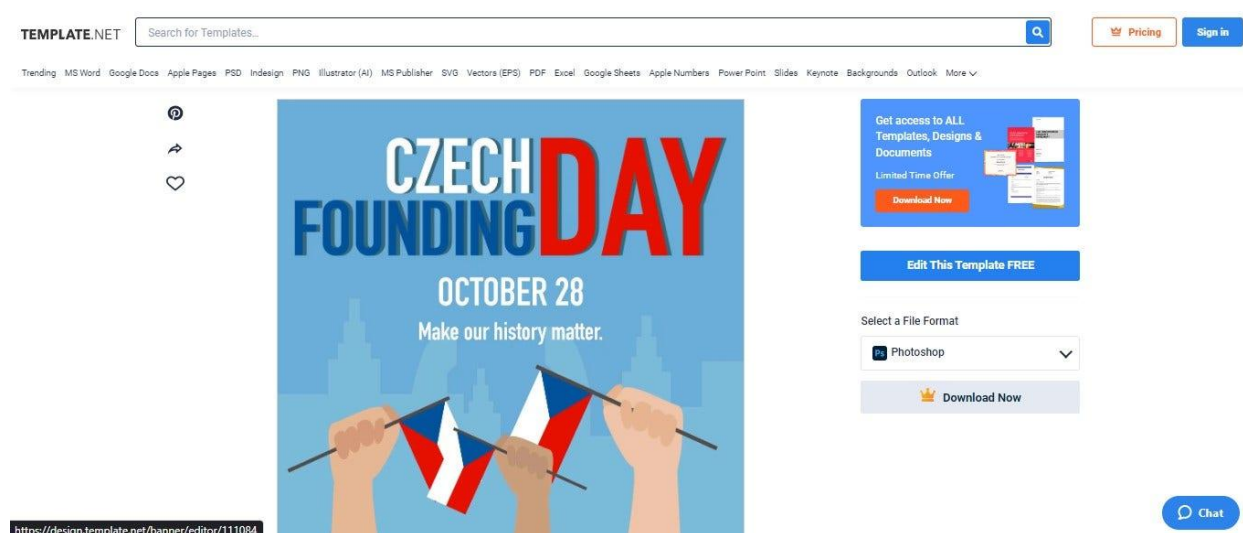

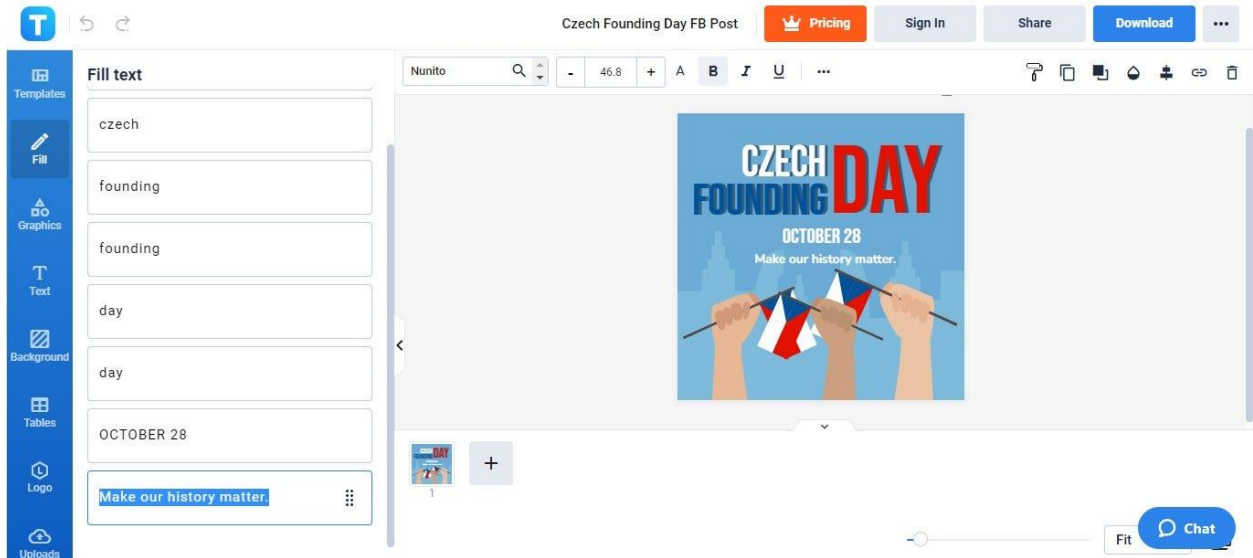

1. Grab a [Czech Founding Day FB Post](#) Template.



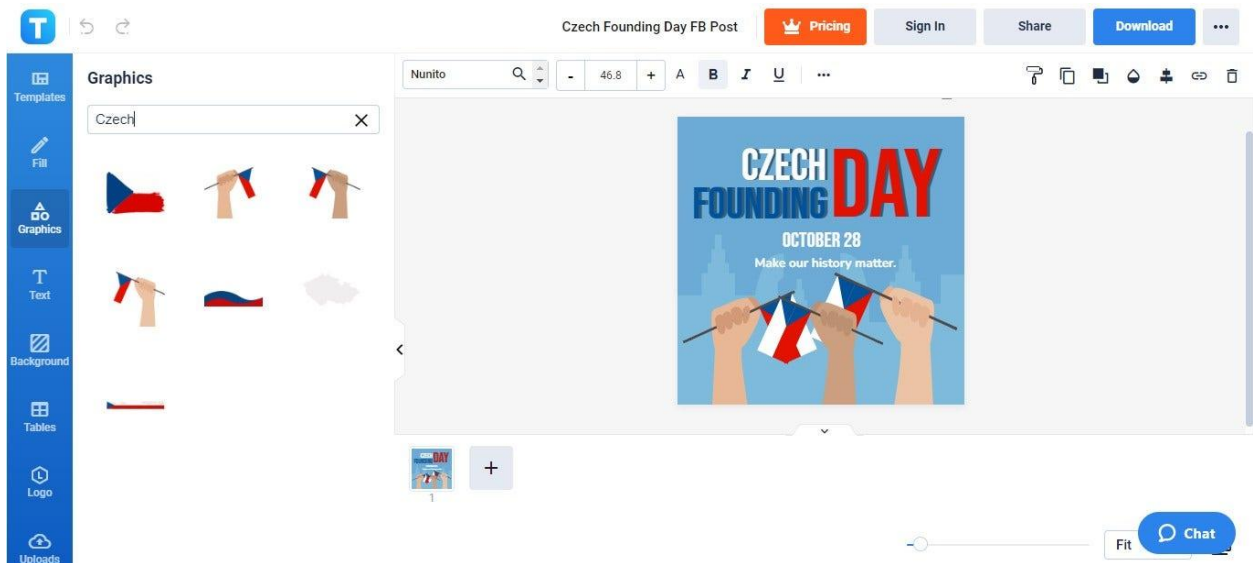

2. Customize the existing Czech Founding Day message.



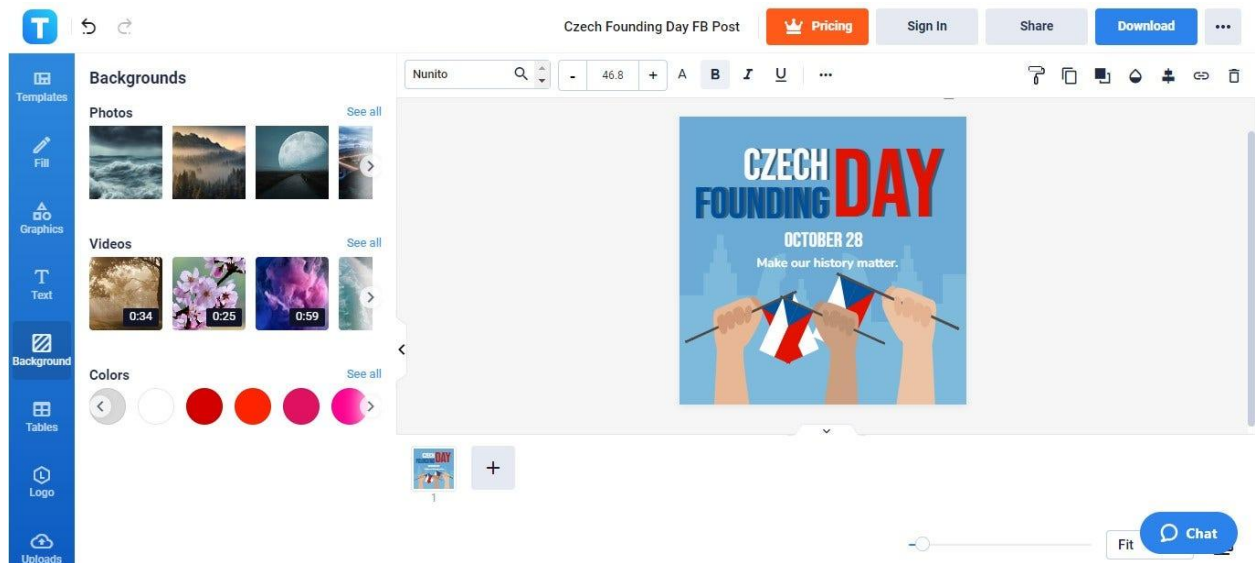

To change it, head to the Fill tab and customize the content of the last Fill Text box. In that box, write your own unique Czech Founding Day quote, slogan, or message. 3. Insert more Czech flag digital art.



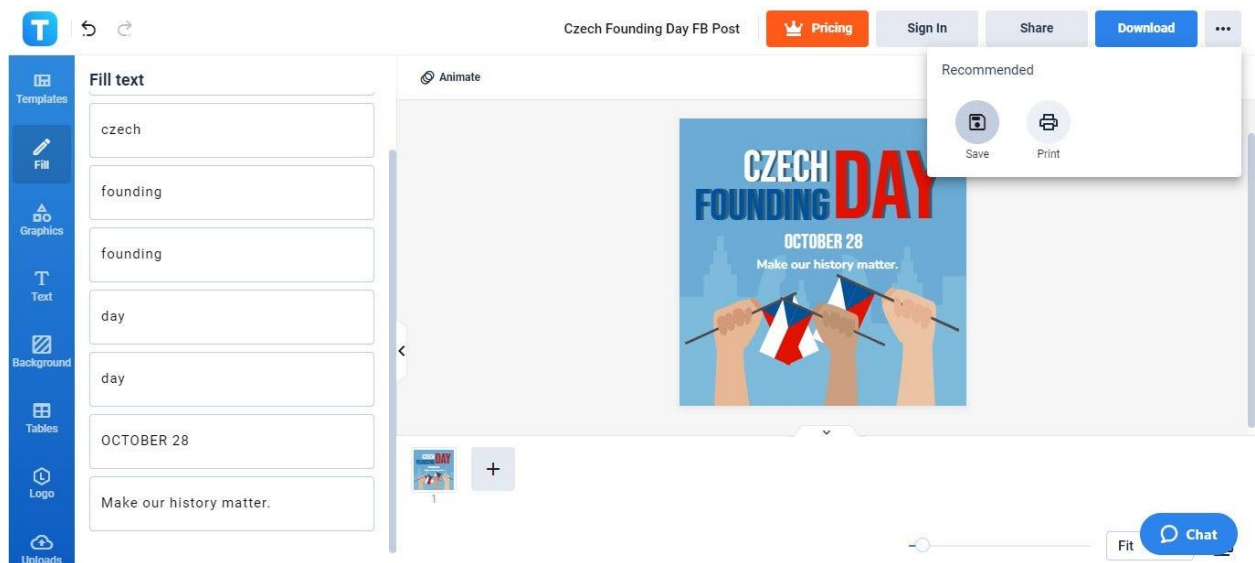
You can make the post template look more patriotic by inserting more Czech flag digital art. The Graphics panel of the Editor tool offers plenty of those. Type the keyword "Czech" in the search box and they'll appear in the results. Click, drag, and drop your selected flag digital art into the FB post template.

4. Be creative with the background.



The template's background is fully customizable in the Editor tool. Go to the Background panel and choose whether to add a background photo or change the background color. You're free to choose how to personalize it, or you can keep the background as it is if you like it enough.

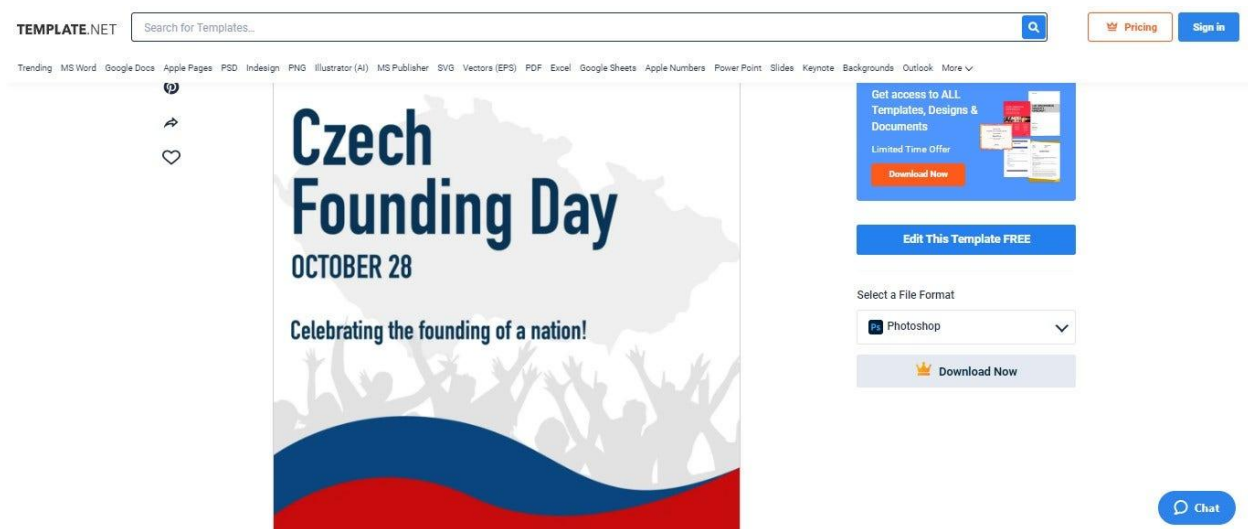
5. Save the customized FB template.



Most importantly, you need to save the customized template so you can use and upload it on October 28. Select the button on the upper right side of the Editor page and the Recommended pop-up menu will appear. In it, click the Save button.

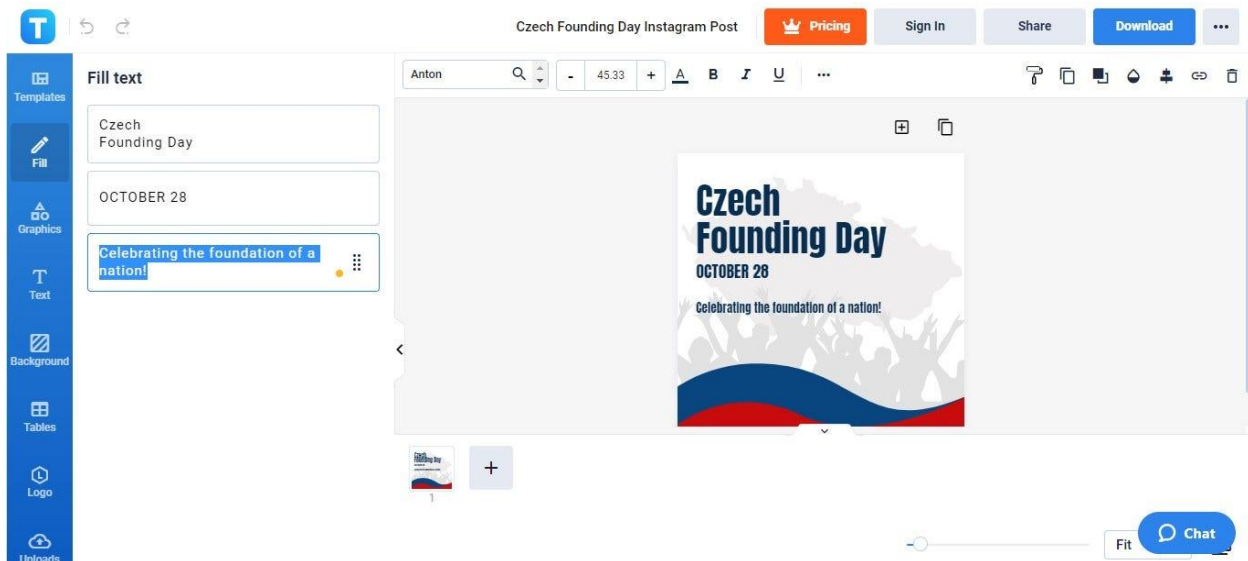
Instagram

1. Use a [Czech Founding Day Instagram Post](#) Template.

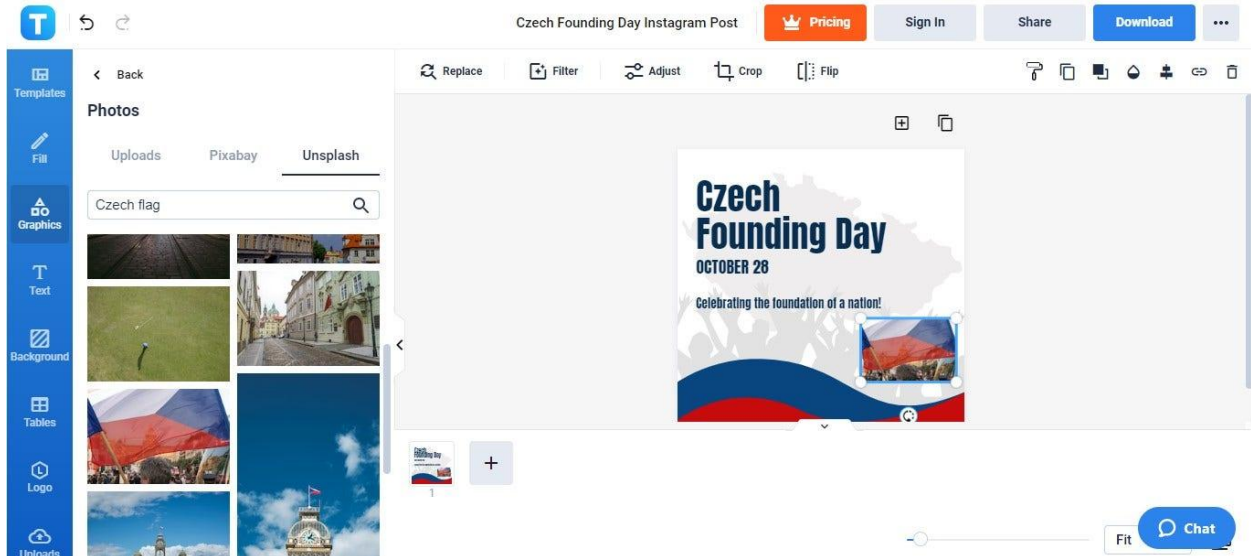
2. Input your own Czech Founding Day message.



For sure, you have your own Czech Founding Day message in mind. The template already has one, but you're free to change it. Access the Fill panel of the Editor tool and write your creative Czech Founding Day message in the third Fill Text box. A short one

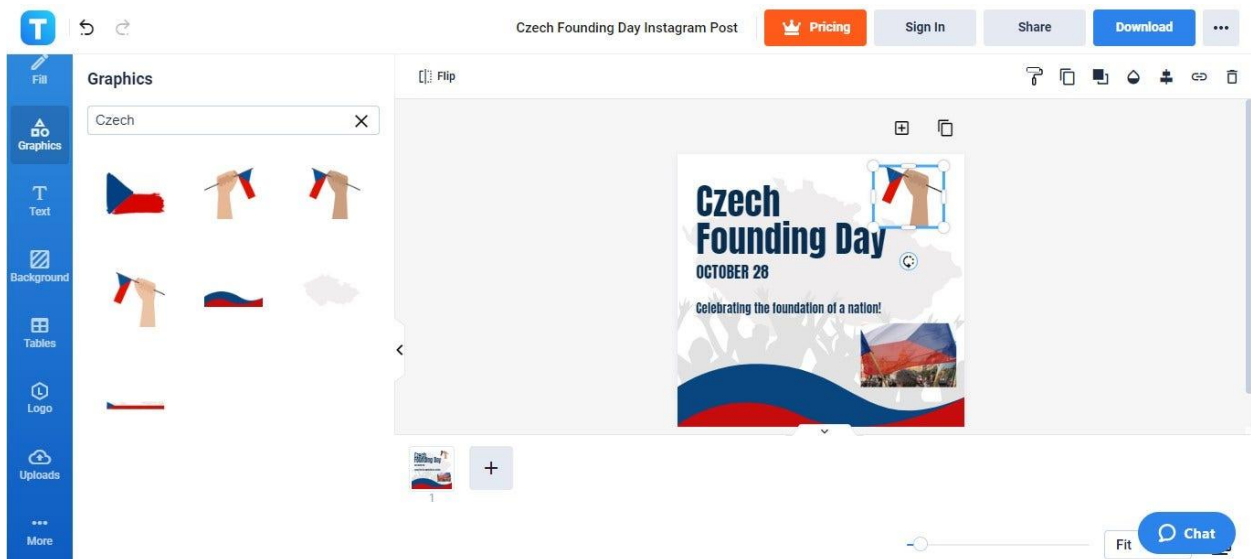
would be ideal with not more than six words. Moreover, you can experiment with different font styles for the text. The toolbar above offers plenty of font style options.

3. Insert Czech Republic photos.



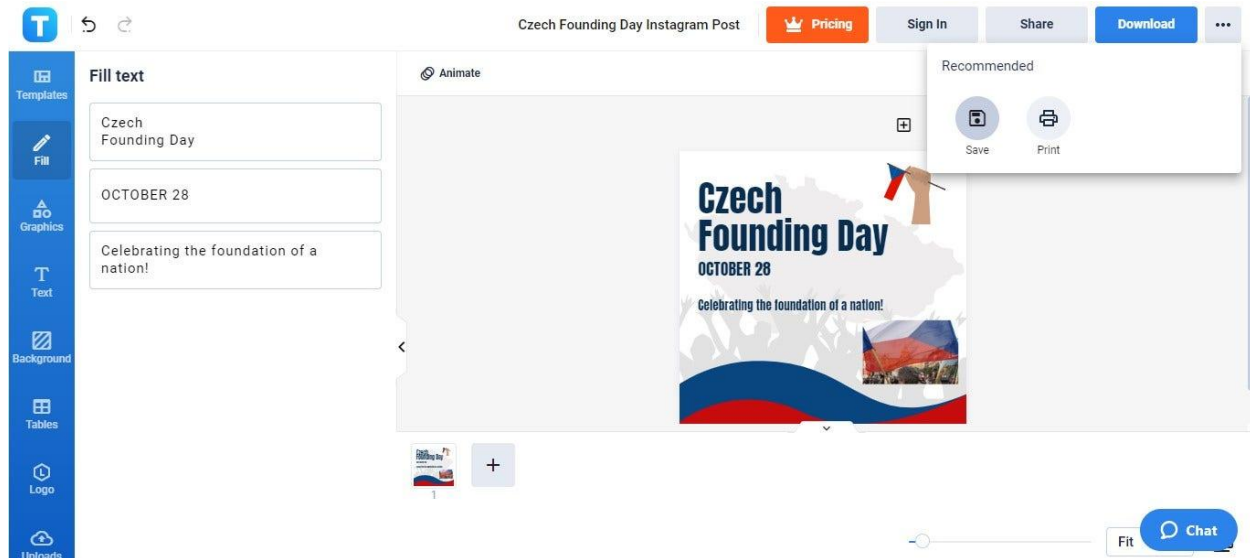
You can insert photos of the Czech Republic and arrange them like a collage in the template. Head to the Graphics panel, click "See All" in the Photos section, and type "Czech" or "Czech flag" in the search box of Unsplash. Just click, drag, and drop the photos that you want into the Instagram post template.

4. Add Czech flag stickers.



You may add stickers of Czech flags to the Instagram post to make it look livelier and more patriotic. The Graphics panel has many of them that you can simply drag and drop into the template. Just type "Czech" in the search box. Once they're inserted, you can resize them and move them to a better position in the template.

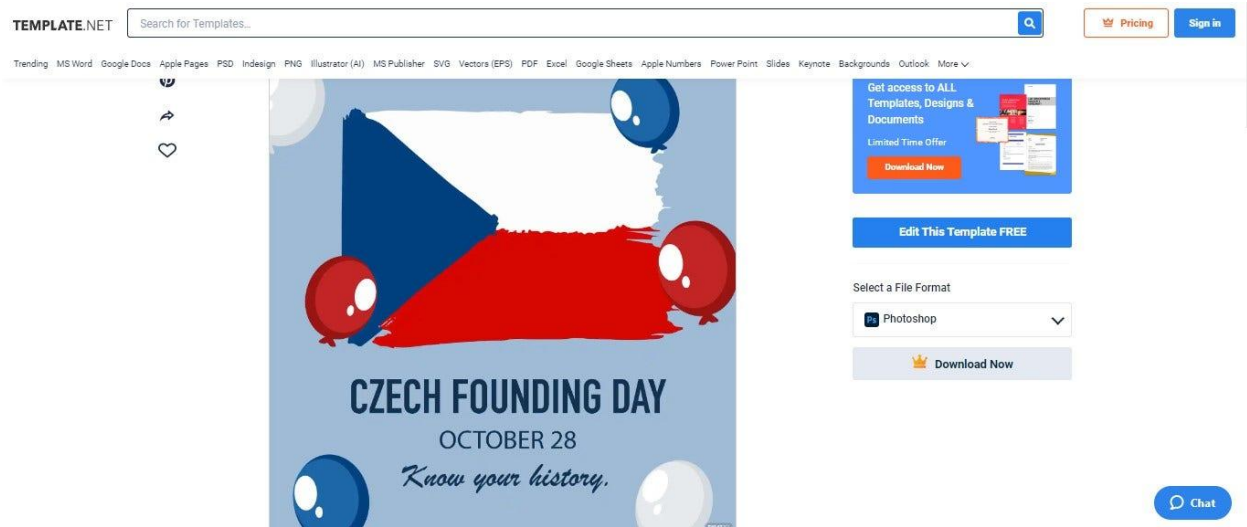
5. Save the edited Czech Founding Day template.

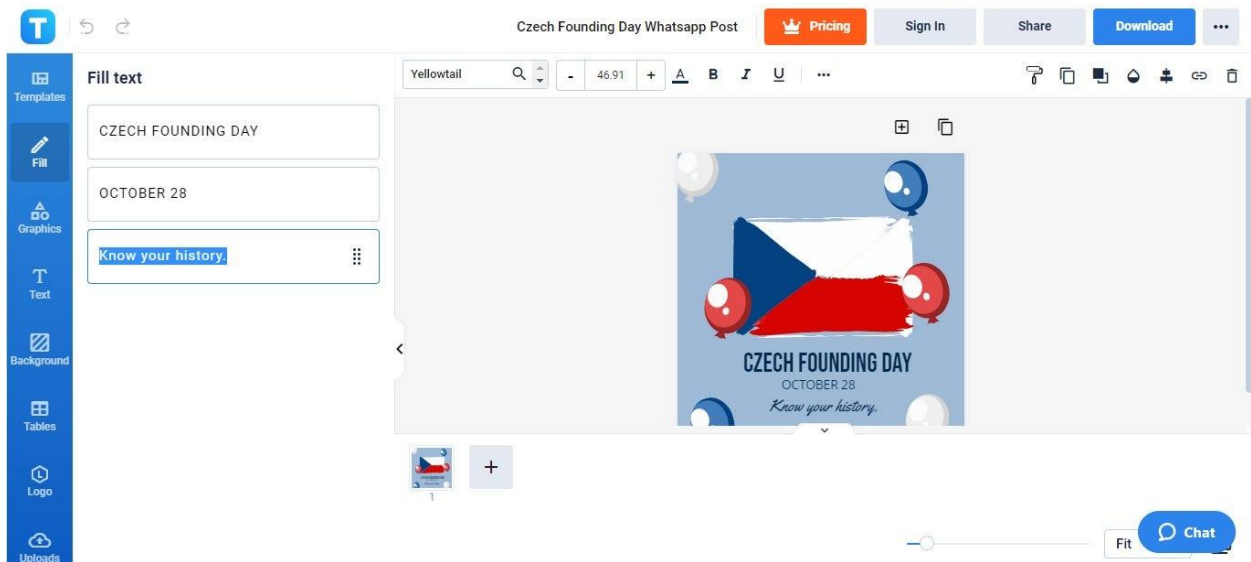

1. Open a [Czech Founding Day Whatsapp Post](#) Template.



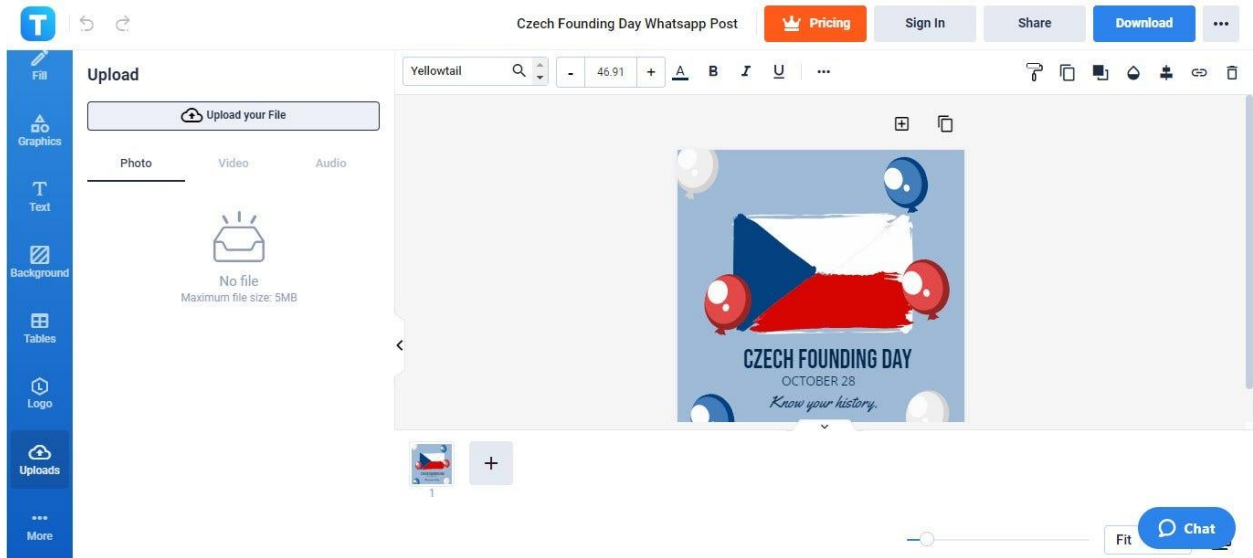

2. Let your voice be heard.



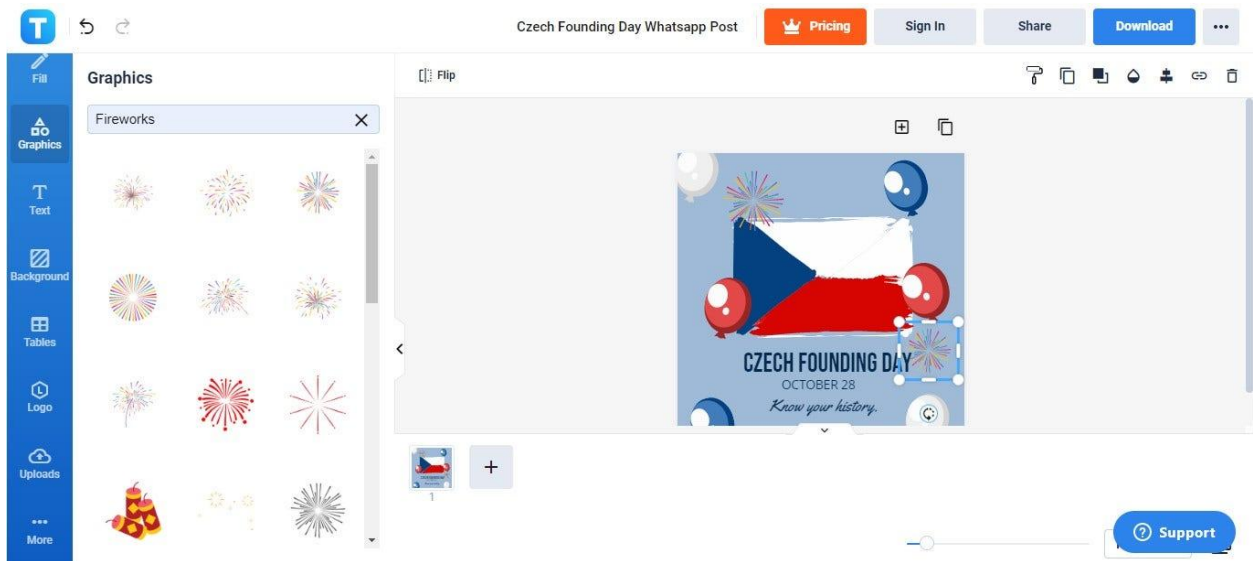

3. Upload and insert Czech-related photos.



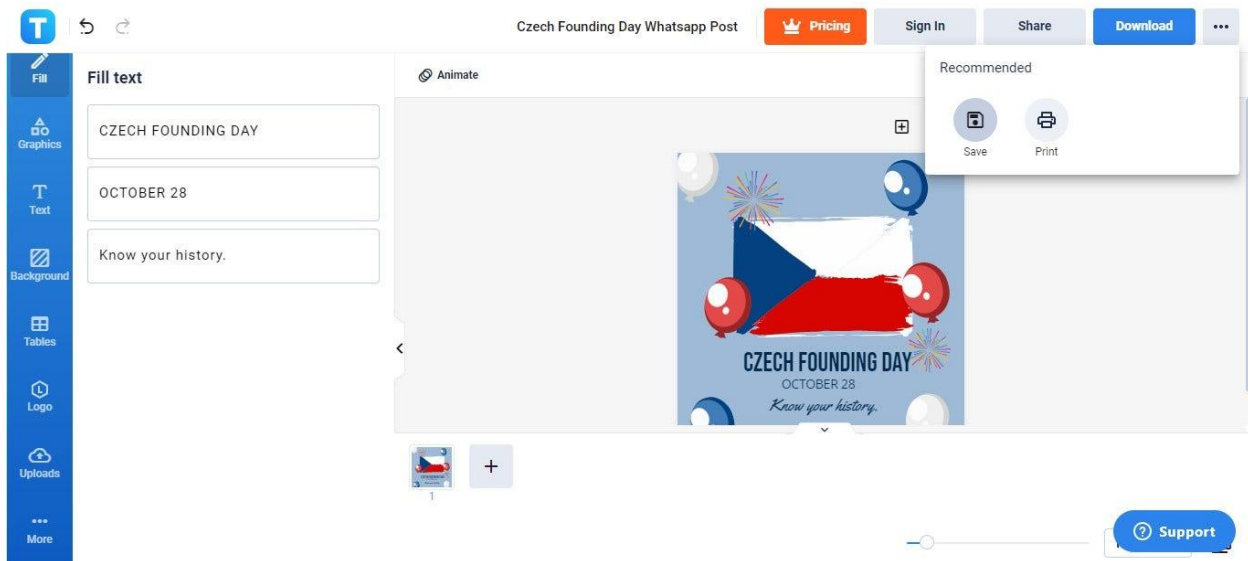

Browse through your folders and select the photo you want to upload. You can upload two or more if you want. Once the photos are uploaded, click the Photo section. Drag and drop the Czech-related photos and arrange them like a collage.

4. Insert stickers of fireworks.



Stickers of fireworks would be a nice addition to the design since Czech Founding Day is a festive and joyful holiday. Open the Graphics panel and type "Fireworks" in the search box.
