Dhanteras Definition & Meaning

Dhanteras is a Hindu observance that's also called Dhanatrayodashi; it is a celebration that marks the start of the Diwali festivities.

On the occasion of Dhanteras, Hindus honor Lord Dhanvantari and the Goddess Lakshmi so that they may receive the blessings of health, fortune, and happiness.

When is Dhanteras?

Dhanteras is observed on the thirteenth lunar day of Karthik month based on the Hindu calendar. In 2022, the festival falls on October 23, two days before the Diwali or Deepavali celebration.

Dhanteras History

The term Dhanteras consists of two words, "dhan" which means wealth, and "teras" which means the thirteenth day. According to the legend of Samundra Manthan, Lord Vishnu's consort Goddess Lakshmi emerged from an ocean of milk. Another popular legend tells the tale of the God Dhanvantari-also known as the god of medicine and a personification of Lord Vishnu- who emerged from the sea as well while holding a Kalash Amrit and the sacred textbook of Ayurveda. Devotees honor and worship these two deities on Dhanteras to seek their blessings for a prosperous and happy life.

Dhanteras Purpose and Importance

The Dhanteras festival holds much meaning for the people of India, and in the Hindu culture, the holiday is not just a festive occasion, but it is also deeply rooted in religious tradition and belief as well.

Day to Increase Wealth and Prosperity

Dhanteras is an ideal day for Indians and Hindu devotees to increase their wealth and prosperity. The origin of the word itself comes from "dhan" which literally translates to wealth. People engage in all sorts of traditions and rituals on Dhanteras in hopes of securing a flourishing and prosperous future.

Day of Worship



1. Choose an editable Dhanteras Facebook Post Template




Use the search bar to browse the various free and customizable Dhanteras templates. After choosing a template, click on it then hit the "Edit this Template for Free" button to edit the template.

2. Edit the Text or Caption





3. Provide More Images or Graphics







2. Create a Personalized Message





3. Add More Graphical Elements






In the search bar, key in Dhanteras to browse the various templates. Pick a template that matches your needs then click on the "Edit This Template for Free" button to customize it.

2. Write a Custom Greeting




You can edit the text or caption by selecting the Fill icon located on the sidebar menu. It is best to keep your message short, sweet, and straight to the point.

3. Add Relevant Images and Graphics





Dhanteras is a Hindu festival that basically celebrates wealth, fortune, and prosperity; the holiday comes right before the Diwali festival or Festival of Lights.


Diwali is a five-day Hindu celebration that is marked by festivities, fireworks, prayer, feasts, and gifts, and it is widely considered India's most important festival.







What is Dhanteras celebrated for?

Dhanteras is an Indian celebration that is centered on gaining prosperity and increasing wealth or fortune.

Which god is worshiped on Dhanteras?

The Hindu god Lord Dhanvantari, also known as the god of medicine and an incarnation of Lord Vishnu, is worshiped on Dhanteras; while the goddess Lakshmi, Lord Ganesha, and Lord Kubera are also honored during Dhanteras.

How many diyas are lit on Dhanteras?

As tradition goes, 13 diyas or lamps are lit on Dhanteras and should be kept burning throughout the night to honor the Hindu gods Lakshmi and Dhanvantari and to ward off death.

What rituals are performed in Dhanteras?

Traditional rituals on Dhanteras include performing puja or a ceremonial offering for each of the Hindu deities, reciting Dhanteras ki Katha, and lastly, lighting and placing 13 diyas outside the house.

What do you say on Dhanteras?

On the celebration of Dhanteras, people often greet each other by wishing them prosperity and fortune and by asking the Lord Kuber and Goddess Lakshmi to bless them with wealth.

What is lucky to buy on Dhanteras?

Precious metals such as gold and silver are deemed lucky to buy on Dhanteras so to attract fortune; jewelry and utensils are also considered acceptable to buy on Dhanteras.

Which direction should we keep diyas during Dhanteras?

Diyas should be lit facing the southern direction of your house in order to ward off death.

What is the significance of Dhanteras?

In traditional Hindu culture, devotees believe that the cleansing and renewal that Dhanteras signifies will bring wealth, happiness, peace, and prosperity into their homes and lives.

How do people celebrate Dhanteras?

Indians thoroughly clean their homes on Dhanteras, buy precious metals, and light diyas or lamps in honor of the goddess Lakshmi and Lord Dhanvantari.

Why do we light diyas on Dhanteras?

Diyas or earthen lamps are lit around the house to ward off death and evil spirits but also to obtain the blessings and favor of Lord Yama.

What is the reason behind Dhanteras?

The Hindu festival of Dhanteras is essentially a celebration of wealth, prosperity, health, and good fortune.

Which things are good for Dhanteras?

Buying items made of brass, silver, and gold such as jewelry or utensils is considered good for Dhanteras along with brooms and idols of different Hindu deities.

Why is buying gold important on Dhanteras?

It is important because gold is seen as a precious symbol of wealth and prosperity, and many devotees also believe that offering gold to the goddess Lakshmi will earn her favor.

Are Dhanteras and Diwali the same?

No, Dhanteras and Diwali are two separate festivals; however, they are closely linked because Dhanteras signals the start of the Diwali festival.

What should you not buy on Dhanteras?

On Dhanteras, it is highly discouraged to buy products or objects made from glass or plastic, iron, and
sharp objects.
