There is also some evidence that a version of Durga Puja was celebrated by Jains in the 11th and 12th Centuries. Over the centuries and decades, the festival has been celebrated by Indians, Bengalis, and other nationalities practicing Hinduism.

Durga Puja Purpose, Importance

Durga Puja is on UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH) list since December of 2021 and rightfully so. Its purpose, importance, and impact on Hinduism are things to be admired not just by the Hindus but also by people around the world.

Celebrate Durga's Victory

Durga's victory against Mahishasura is a classic tale of good prevailing over evil. In many cultural traditions, such tales are celebrated and Durga's story is no exception. Ancient and modern Hindus commemorate her victory and regard her as a beacon of good, hope, and light in the darkness.

Worship Durga

Throughout the 10-day festival of Durga Puja, especially the second half, the Hindus offer prayers, offer gifts, and perform rituals worshipping Durga. Other Hindu deities are also honored and worshiped throughout the celebrations such as Lakshmi, Ganesha, Saraswati, and Kartikeya.

Pray for Salvation and Purity

Durga is believed to grant peace of mind through positive energy which helps an individual attain salvation and purity. The Hindus regard her as a mother goddess of protection, strength, creation, and life; she's like a patron saint of those elements. They believe she embraces those who yearn for her motherly care. So on Durga Puja, they pray to her wholeheartedly for salvation and purity.

What's in Durga Puja?

During the 10-day Durga Puja celebrations, the streets of Hindu towns and cities will be brightened by lights and full of Durga devotees. There'll be singing performances of religious songs, dance performances, rituals, processions, and more. Houses will be decorated with pandals, idols, and other decorations in theme with the festival.




<u>Dussehra</u> is also a Hindu festival and it's celebrated in honor of Rama and his victory over another infamous demon king—Ravana.
